Mt. Vernon Unitarian Universalist Fellowship's 10:00 AM service on Sunday, August 3 will be dedicated to Linda Kraeger and Greg McKendry, who died in the shooting Sunday, July 27, 2008 at Tennessee Valley Unitarian Universalist Church in Knoxville, TN, and to the other victims of that shooting. The service will be led by Paul Oakley, who will read a sermon titled "Being Compassion," written by the Rev. Michael McGee of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Arlington, VA. The service will include a time of silence in respect for the victims of the shooting and a time for sharing our personal responses to the tragedy, as well as an inspirational reading from Buddhist teacher Pema Chödrön's book "When Things Fall Apart," "The Prayer of a Dying Man" from the Dinka people of the Sudan, Thich Nhat Hanh's poem "Please Call Me By My True Names," "Victory is Ours" a litany by Anglican Archbishop Desmond Tutu, a blessing from the Vedic scriptures of ancient India, "Ode to Silence" by Mark Belletini, and the poem "I Am No Longer Afraid of Death" by Julia Esquivel. The congregation will sing the hymn "Spirit of Life." Recorded music will include Ian Anderson's "In Defense of Faiths," Zola Van's "Trail of Tears: Kyrie at Brownfield," and "The Lord's Prayer" as sung by Isaac Cates and Ordained.

## **Upcoming Services:**

**August 3<sup>rd</sup>:** *Being Compassion*. Paul Oakley will lead this service, dedicated to the victims of the Tennessee Valley UU Church Shootings.

**August 10<sup>th</sup>:** *Musical Guests, Clap em' Wild Barn Trio*. Angela Czapiewski will lead this service as we welcome back the classical trio for a morning of music.

**August 17<sup>th</sup>: Open Readings.** Adam Stone will lead this open reading service. Please bring short readings, thoughts, music, or artwork to share. Open Reading Services take place on the third Sunday of each month.

August 24<sup>th</sup>: *The Sacred Path of the Warrior*. Luke Sanford Crawford will draw on the writings of contemporary Buddhist teacher Chogyam Trungpa in describing the ancient Tibetan idea of Shambhala, an enlightened society. Particular emphasis will be placed on the inward journey to enlightened warriorship, which leads to total self-mastery and fearlessness. Examples of the enlightened warrior include the Japanese Samurai, Arjuna of the Bhagavad Gita, King David of the Old Testament, and some Amerindian tribes.

August 31<sup>st</sup>: We are still in need of a volunteer to lead this service, which is over Labor Day weekend.

**September 7<sup>th</sup>:** *Special Guest Rabbi Joshua Taub will speak on the subject of Racism Eradication.* Paul Oakley will lead this service as we welcome Rabbi Taub back to our fellowship. Rabbi Taub has worked extensively in his community on eradicating racism, and will speak to us about his experiences.

September 14<sup>th</sup>: We are in need of a volunteer to lead this Open Reading Service. Please bring short readings, thoughts, music, or artwork to share. Open Reading Services normally take place on the third Sunday of each month, but because of our special guest on September 21<sup>st</sup>, this one is on the second Sunday.

**September 21**<sup>st</sup>: *Special Guest Rev. Daniel O'Connell*. Rev. Daniel O'Connell of Eliot Chapel in Kirkwood, Missouri will speak on this morning. Shannon Green will lead the service.

**September 28**<sup>th</sup>: *The Shofar (Jewish New Year)*. Paul Oakley will lead this service, which takes place during the Jewish High Holy Days.
