MVUUF is now a Welcoming Congregation!

In the words of Paul Oakley, Taskforce for Lesbian, Bay Bisexual, and Transgender Concerns:

Sunday, May 16, 2010 We're a Welcoming Congregation now!

This morning, after our worship service, at our annual meeting of the membership, Mt. Vernon (IL) Unitarian Universalist Fellowship (MVUUF) voted to take on the mantle of Welcoming Congregation, indicating a proactive inclusion of Lesbians, Gay Men, Bisexuals, Transgender and anyone else "not necessarily straight."

We began this journey in the summer of 2007 with the Board of Trustees approving the formation of a standing Taskforce for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Concerns, whose first task was to lead the congregation through the process culminating in the vote which took place today. The initial members of the Taskforce, a standing committee of the fellowship, were Diane Schwitz, Shannon Green, and Paul Oakley. That fall, the Taskforce began planning, buying the Welcoming Congregation Handbook, preparing for the workshop series, and leading the congregation in a worship service introducing the process and focusing on sexual(ity) and gender equality.

In January 2008 we met for our first Welcoming Congregation Workshop. We held these workshops on Wednesday evenings once a month until the fall of 2009, when we completed the full series presented in the handbook. Along the way, a couple of times through each calendar year, the Taskforce led worship services to bring the work of the workshops and the welcoming message to the full population, since naturally, not every person was present at the workshops.

In October 2009, after completing the workshop part of the process, we had a meeting of the membership to consider the changes needed to our bylaws and the commitments we would need to make to be a Welcoming Congregation. In December the Taskforce tackled specific wording to recommend to the Board, including changes to three sections of our bylaws and the creation of a Welcoming Congregation Covenant. In January the Board approved the wording as presented, put the vote on the agenda for today's meeting, and presented the full congregation with these changes for feedback. No additional changes in wording were suggested. And today we voted!

It was UNANIMOUS! In addition to the explicitly inclusive language included in the Bylaws, the Welcoming Congregation Covenant is an important document showing future members and reminding current members precisely what we as a congregation have committed ourselves to.

On Pride Sunday, the last Sunday of June, the Taskforce on LGBT Concerns will lead a Pride service celebrating our congregation's (more fully) coming out, as it were, as a Welcoming Congregation.

Our next step is to present the required documentation to the UUA to have this status certified. But we are now a Welcoming Congregation. Celebrate with us!

Here is the text of the Welcoming Congregation Covenant, which is incorporated by reference into the Bylaws:

Welcoming Congregation Covenant

We, the members of Mt. Vernon Unitarian Universalist Fellowship, approve and affirm the designation of this Fellowship as a Welcoming Congregation, in compliance with the recognition requirements of the Unitarian Universalist Association of Congregations.

We covenant to be inclusive and expressive of the concerns of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and/or Transgender persons at every level of congregational life—welcoming not only their presence but the unique gifts and particularities of their lives as well.

We covenant not to assume anyone's affectional or sexual orientation and/or gender identity. Vocabulary of worship shall reflect this perception; our worship shall celebrate diversity by inclusivity of language and content.

We covenant to fully incorporate throughout all programs, including religious education, an understanding of the experience of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and/or Transgender persons.

We covenant to maintain in our bylaws and other official documents an affirmation of inclusion and a nondiscrimination clause affecting all dimensions of congregational life, including membership, hiring practices, and the calling of religious professionals.

We covenant to engage in outreach to the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and/or Transgender communities, through our advertising and by actively supporting other LGBT affirming groups.

We covenant to offer congregational and ministerial support for services of union and memorial services for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and/or Transgender persons, and celebrations of evolving definitions of family.

We covenant to celebrate the lives of all people and welcome same-gender couples, recognizing their committed relationships, and equally affirm displays of caring and affection without regard for sexual orientation.

We covenant to nurture ongoing dialogue between people of different affectional or sexual orientations and gender identifications, and to create deeper trust and sharing.

We covenant to encourage the presence of a chapter of Interweave (the Unitarian Universalists for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and/or Transgender concerns) when such a chapter is feasible.

We covenant to affirm and celebrate Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and/or Transgender issues and history during the church year.

We covenant, as an advocate for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender people, to work to promote justice, freedom, and equality in the larger society. We shall speak out when the rights and dignity of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and/or Transgender people are at stake.

We covenant to celebrate the lives of all people and their ways of expressing their love for each other.
