The UUSC Link

The UUSC is an independent human rights organization, supported by the volunteer efforts and financial gifts of its members and supporters, and linked to UU congregations through local representatives. The four focus areas of its work include: *Rights in Humanitarian Crises; Civil Liberties; Economic Justice;* and *Environmental Justice*.

Advocacy is a critical part of how UUSC makes change in the world. But we need your help! By taking action, you raise awareness of social justice and apply moral and political pressure where it is needed most.

The UUSC website, under the tab "what we do/public policy," informs members and friends of action alerts. Action alerts featured this month include Save Fair Trade (in opposition to Fair Trade USA's move to lower standards for products labeled as Fair Trade), \$2.13 an Hour is Unfair (urging Congress to raise the tipped minimum wage); End Discrimination at Darden Restaurants (telling Darden Restaurants that exploiting workers is unacceptable), and Voice Your Support for the Occupy Movement (sign an open letter in support of the principles of the Occupy Movement).

More information and suggested letters on each of these issues, and more, is available on the UUSC website. Write a letter, tell a friend. Word of mouth is critical to building support for human rights and change.
