The UUSC Link

The UUSC is an independent human rights organization, supported by the volunteer efforts and financial gifts of its members and supporters, and linked to UU congregations through local representatives. The four focus areas of its work include: *Rights in Humanitarian Crises; Civil Liberties; Economic Justice;* and *Environmental Justice*.

January 12, 2013 marks the third anniversary of the earthquake which devastated Haiti. I would like to share with you this update on UUSC's work in Haiti, from the Volunteer Bulletin.

"UUSC is piloting a new approach to our disaster response in Haiti. UUSC usually sends out an appeal for funds for emergency response following a major natural disaster with human rights implications, such as the tsunami, Gulf Coast flooding, or the January 12, 2010 Haiti earthquake. This enables UUSC to zero in with our signature approach of working with those left behind by other relief programs. Subsequently, we plan program work to apply our resources over two to three years.

"So traditionally UUSC would be winding down our program as Haiti gears up for the third commemoration of the earthquake. Instead UUSC is trying a new path in Haiti, transitioning an emergency response to a long term recovery program. After three years of working in Haiti with our partners and the vision and experience of Haiti Program Manager Wendy Flick, we have successful disaster response models in trauma response, rural resettlement, child protection, gender based violence, and rescuing children from slavery and servitude. Transitioning into long-term recovery in Haiti means we can deepen and expand these successful models, multiply their effects, and train other NGOs in what has worked. As we spend down funds raised in the emergency appeal, we will initiate raising additional funds around work that has already successfully created change at the grassroots in Haiti. Our eye to eye partnership has enabled us to build creative and dynamic relationships with partners so we can move forward together, bringing the voices of those on the margins into the essence of the work of ongoing recovery."
