The steering committee continued to address a variety of concerns, both housekeeping and institutional. Randy began to look into the possibility of selling the pews and purchasing more comfortable chairs. Members of the steering committee looked at such issues as creating bylaws, incorporation, and the like. Late in the month, the members hosted a Halloween celebration, intended to engage children in the neighborhood; response from the neighbors was thin, but members enjoyed the opportunity for fellowship.
