The Social Justice Interest Group hosts the Open Minds discussion series to encourage exploration and discussion of social justice and related issues. During the winter months Open Minds will meet following the service and coffee hour on the second Sunday of the month. Bring a brown bag lunch. In the summer the schedule will return to the third Wednesday of each month at 6:30 p.m. at the Fellowship building, The series is open to the public.

The topic for January is Green Burial, an alternative to traditional burial and cremation. The deceased is laid to rest with only biodegradable materials in a specially designated site. This practice can be used to express conservation ("green") and spiritual values.



In her Nov 27 service, "Searching for Mary," Melissa Webster shared stories from <u>Looking For Mary by Beverly Donofrio</u> and from her aunt, Episcopal minister Ann Markle, who on her blog <u>One Wild and Precious Life</u> describes her courage to say Yes, to pre-marital motherhood, to the priesthood, and to the multiple challenges life brings.

"It's important to know that there are some things we will never be prepared for unless and until we take them on, and then we will grow into them. Like Mary, we trust the wings will appear. And more often than not, they do. And we fly."

"Though this Message was titled Searching for Mary, truly, Mary found me. Strong, fearless (or fearful but brave), determined, opinionated Mary, who will not be silenced, even today.... So for the next four weeks, we wait like she waited. We wait and trust and hope. The light will return to the world."
