### Wed. May 17 6:30~ Open Minds Discussion ~Forgiveness

The Social Justice Interest Group hosts the Open Minds discussion series to encourage exploration and discussion of social justice and related issues that are current to our everyday lives. Open Minds meets the third Wednesday of each month at 6:30 p.m. at the Fellowship building, We may discuss environmental, social justice, or animal welfare issues. There are no right or wrong answers, just a healthy discussion about topics that have many sides or possibly controversial. You will be energized by the lively discussions and learn from them.

Coffee and refreshments will be served. Everyone is welcome. One need not be a member of the fellowship to attend, as the series is open to the public.

The May discussion on Forgiveness, led by Gail DeVilbiss, will explore all aspects of forgiveness including definitions, health benefits, and what motivates people to forgive. Attendees will review a process some use to evaluate the situation and ultimately forgive someone who has hurt or harmed them or someone close to them. Is it forgiveness if we employ other punishments as the crime warrants? Discussion will explore some recent accounts of forgiveness and consider if we are willing or could forgive the parties involved.

April's topic was the Sanctuary Movement, led by Donna Beaumont. "'Sanctuary' is a word that many faith communities are engaging heavily with since Election Day, be it about making sanctuary in our places of worship or aboutpolicies that create sanctuary for undocumented people in cities and towns. For others, it signifies the kind of organizing communities are taking on to protect and defend Muslim communities, undocumented communities, LGBTQ communities, and Black Lives Matter activists. how we can show up for ourselves, our families, our neighborhoods and communities."

This, and ideas for how we might begin to network more effectively, will be addressed at future social justice interest group meeting.

MVUUF Social Justice Interest Group activities provides a meeting ground for individuals to get together to develop projects, such as the One Hope outreach, and sponsors the Open Minds forum and some Sunday services. MVUUF areas of interest over the past reflected in the Open Minds discussion topics have addressed **environmental justice and civil (minority) rights**. Discussion included the distance from the UUANI activities in Springfield and Chicago area, and from other religious/spiritual organizations in Mt Vernon area.
