Tenth Anniversary of Mt Vernon UUF

In late 2004, Randall S. "Randy" Farrar, a Mt. Vernon businessman, philanthropist, and Unitarian Universalist who had been attending the Carbondale Unitarian Fellowship in Carbondale, Illinois, for several years, decided to "bring Unitarianism back to Mt. Vernon."

(The Mt Vernon Universalist Church existed from about 1880 to 1925, and met in what is presently the Elks Club.)

Randy purchased the former Faith Lutheran Church, located at 1600 Isabella Avenue in Mt. Vernon, in December 2004. A small group from the Carbondale fellowship began planning meetings in January 2005, and informational meetings open to the public began in March, 2005. A core group began to form, and regular meetings and services have been held since that time as the Mount Vernon Unitarian Universalist Fellowship.

Sadly, Randy Farrar passed away in July 2006, but his memory lives on as the founding member of our fellowship. Other names that appear in early records include Dennis Arnold, Shannon Green, Adam Stone, Vito Mastrangelo, Beth Brennan, Paul Oakley, Walter Lazenby, Glenda Eubanks, Vicki Doetsch, Nina Peacock, Diane Schwitz, Saribenne Evesong, and Kelly and Shawn Taylor.

This year – 2015 – marks the tenth anniversary of the activities that led to the Fellowship we now appreciate and enjoy. All year long, we will bring you reminders of landmarks along the way to the first congregational meeting which was held in May 2006. The plan is to hold a significant celebration in May 2016 to mark that occasion.

A study group – *Building Your Own Theology* – was held during these formative days, led by Vennie Anderson from the Carbondale fellowship. We would like to offer it again this year, as part of the celebration. If you are interested, please let Donna or Glenda know.

If you are one of those founding members, we would like to hear and collect your stories. Again, let Donna or Glenda know how you would like to participate. This will be fun!

Open Minds Discussion Returns


